10:30 ~ CUPNOODLES MUSEUM

Cup Noodles Museum is an interactive museum celebrating the achievements of Momofuku Ando, inventor of instant noodles, and the history of instant ramen.

The exhibits showcase "Chicken Ramen" — the world's first instant ramen, created in 1958 — and the story behind the creation of "Cup Noodles".

At "My Cup Noodles Factory", visitors can design their own cup, choose their favourite soup and toppings, and create a one-of-a-kind Cup Noodles.

A popular destination for all ages, the museum offers a wonderful glimpse into food culture and the spirit of invention.

Tenjinbashi-suji Shopping Street is known as the longest shopping street in Japan, stretching approximately 2.6 kilometres and lined with everything from long-established specialist stores to casual eateries.

Street food is a highlight, with local favourites such as takoyaki, freshly fried croquettes and crepes on offer, loved by locals and visitors alike.

Just one street west lies Ura-Temma, a warren of narrow alleyways filled with characterful izakaya and standing bars. Retaining a wonderfully retro atmosphere, it is one of Osaka's finest spots for food and drink, offering a different side of the city's charm found only in its backstreets.

18:00 ~ Kitashinchi

To conclude your day, head to Kitashinchi — a sophisticated, adult district, perfect for savouring the lingering memories of your journey.

Kushidokoro Mogami, a long-established restaurant with over 40 years of history, serves creative kushiage, Japan's skewered and deep-fried delicacy, made with seasonal ingredients. Its relaxed setting makes it a wonderful choice for first-time kushiage diners and special dinners alike.
